The shadow appears to grow as the object is reaching the ground




What appears to be falling is a box (preferably a **GIFT** box)

A gif box is considered to be something that has positive associations. It also implies that a present is being given (i.e to the audience) and it's strongly connected to the visual identity of iENTER as well


The use of the actual logo in the conference animations might be a bit redundant, so I suggest using a metaphor of the gift box to reinforce the content.




As the box finally falls it tilts the screen to indicate the impact. The sound effect as well.
optional: In addition there could be other boxes falling as well in the background (richer animation)



The arrows are lifting the box




