window, place the object off the page to the left. Similarly if you want it to stick to the right edge of the window, place it off the page to the right.

And this is how that page will appear in the browser window.

Sticky items normally float on top of the rest of the page, so would normally be arranged to be at the front of all the page content. However you can also have sticky objects behind your page content if you place them on the Pasteboard Background (on page 452) layer.
